



GUADALUPE '90

Depicted on the cover is a bas-relief of Our Lady of Guadalupe mounted over the front portal of Mission San José located four miles south of San Antonio, Texas. The Mission will be the scene, on Saturday evening, October 13, 1990 of the climactic event of **Guadalupe '90**. Youth of the Archdiocese of San Antonio will conduct a candlelight procession around the grounds of this historic Mission, followed by a living rosary, songs and dances.

Mission San José is located in the San Antonio Missions National Historic Park which embraces a string of missions established by Franciscan Fathers in the early part of the eighteenth century to Christianize and “civilize” the local tribes. These missions were the foundation settlements of the city of San Antonio and precious treasures of our national heritage. They have been a focus of Southwestern religious life and liturgy for several centuries.

Mission San José was begun in 1720, following by two years its sister mission, San Antonio de Valero, later to be enshrined in Texas history as the locale of the famous “Alamo” battle of 1836. San José became known as the “Queen of the Missions,” one of the most beautiful of the Spanish colonial churches and first among the missions in size, plan, strength and success. It is still an active parish of the Archdiocese of San Antonio.

Given this position of prominence in this “Queen of Missions,” Our Lady of Guadalupe appears as the principal icon of the Catholic faith in its presentation to the indigenous population of the American Southwest.

Guadalupe '90 Program

Thursday, October 11, 1990

A Liturgy of the Eucharist will be celebrated in St. Matthew's Church, 10703 Wurzbach Rd., San Antonio, Texas. First there will be a procession around the church grounds at 7:00 p.m. followed by a Mass at 7:30 p.m. Archbishop Patrick F. Flores will be the celebrant. Theme of the Liturgy will be Our Lady of Guadalupe as Patroness of the unborn. Liturgical singers and dancers will perform.

Friday, October 12, 1990

A "Noche Cultural" will be staged beginning at 7:00 p.m. at Plaza Guadalupe, an outdoor theatre located in the historic parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the heart of San Antonio's "West Side" barrio and the center of its Mexican-American culture. The Plaza was the venue for Pope John Paul II's 1987 symbolic encounter with the Hispanic community of the United States. The "Noche," directed by Ms. Mary Cora Medina, will feature a dramatic re-enactment of the Guadalupe story accompanied by songs, Matachines dances, poems, music and "skits."
